General Information

Founded in 1999, Renaissance Academy (RA) is an award-winning, tuition-free, independent charter school. The high school curriculum is college-preparatory, designed to encourage students to think objectively and to approach life thoughtfully and creatively. The US News & World Report ranked RA #25 out of ALL Pennsylvania public high schools and #1 PA Charter School on their 2022 Best High Schools list. Nationally, the report ranked RA #817 out of the more than 24,000 public high schools reviewed and assessed.

Community

The school is located in Phoenixville, Pennsylvania approximately 20 miles from Philadelphia. RA educates over 1,100 K-12 students from more than 22 different school districts, creating a diverse student population. Of the students in grades 9-12, 30% participate in the National School Lunch Program.

DUAL ENROLLMENT PARTNERSHIP-IMMACULATA UNIVERSITY-Senior Electives

To increase accessibility to our students who hail from 22 surrounding districts, these courses are taught by an Immaculata professor twice a week on our campus. To further increase accessibility, these courses are offered at a discounted rate to our students.

COMMENCEMENT PROJECT

The Commencement Project of Renaissance Academy is designed to encourage each graduating senior to reflect on personal abilities and life experiences, synthesize what they have learned, and apply it to a field of interest with a responsible well-planned methodology of addressing a need in the community, accompanied by 40 hours of service. The objective of this project is to provide the graduating senior of Renaissance Academy with an authentic learning experience outside the classroom where they will find the opportunity to think critically and communicate effectively. Each project is initiated by a personal interest, supported by self-directed research, and resulting in a uniquely formulated presentation.

GRADING POLICY DURING COVID-19

(March through June - Trimester Three 2020)

Due to the unprecedented circumstances caused by COVID-19 and mandatory school closures, the Renaissance Academy adjusted grading calculations for the third-trimester grade of the 2019-2020 school year. A PASS/FAIL method was utilized in conjunction with a numeric Trimester Three grade. Grades within passing range (64.5 and higher) were recorded /calculated as 90% or pass for Trimester Three. Grades below passing were recorded /calculated as earned not to be scored lower than 55%. Students who achieved higher than 90% received their true grade for Trimester Three. High School students did NOT have final exams. The adjusted numerical Trimester Three grades were calculated as normal in the final grade.

This temporary method of grading calculation was in place for Trimester Three of the 2019-2020 School Year only. The 2020-2021 school year was conducted via virtual instruction all year. The exception to this was for students in grades 7-12 identified on a matrix as 'at-risk' who were invited into the building for supervision beginning in February 2021. All High School students had synchronous instruction Monday through Thursday and asynchronous instruction on Fridays in conjunction with teacher office hours. Clubs met virtually on a monthly schedule.

REPORTING DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS

Renaissance Academy does not share disciplinary records with post-secondary institutions. We counsel students to answer honestly any questions regarding their disciplinary history on their college applications.

COLLEGE ACCEPTANCES

View a sample of colleges where students from Renaissance Academy Charter School have been accepted within the last four years. Ninety-five percent of the Class of 2022 was admitted to at least one college or university. Of those choosing to enroll, 76% are attending in-state institutions and 24% are attending out-of-state institutions. The 74 graduates of the Class of 2022 earned over \$14,607,885.00 in college-offered scholarships.
